**Overview:** The local government is required under the Emergency Planning and Community Right-to-Know Act to have a Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). Local Emergency Planning Committees are governed by Nebraska Statute 81 15, 217 (a) through (e) and 81-15, 221, The Nebraska Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act. The activities of this committee include maintenance of the Local Emergency Operations Plan for hazardous material accidents, receiving chemical reports from Title III Facilities, and making that information available to the public.

**Who should attend:** All Mid-level Management Federal/State/Local/ Private Sector & Nongovernmental personnel involved in hazardous material emergency response planning within the county should attend. The committee is composed of representatives from all segments of the community interested in emergency planning and preparedness, LEPCs foster a valuable dialogue among members of the public, industry and government.

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**What are the LEPC requirements?**

Nebraska law (Sections 81-15,215-81-15,221) provides requirements for LEPCs:

- Recruit members to the LEPC
- Elect a chairperson
- Establish rules and procedures
- Meet at least once per year
- Review and update emergency plan
- Provide information to citizens
- Review the need for resources
- Prepare an annual report
