- Thank you for supporting 4-H and the youth of Dodge County.
- With the change from 4-H Support to 4-H Assistant, we have been able to increase our reach and impact in numbers we've never reached before.

The need for a 4-H Support/ Receptionist

- In 2022-23, the 4-H team has made tremendous strides to increase the reach and impact for our Dodge county youth
- Schools, libraries, and clubs have recognized this value and make requests to provide more programming
- The 4-H team has had to turn down opportunities to serve youth due to capacity
- The 4-H team currently spends a significant amount of time completing administrative duties, detracting from programming



Programming in Dodge County

As of June 2023, the Dodge County 4-H program has reached 2298 youth in the county since October 2022. This is a reach of 32% of the total number of school ages youth (7149). For the 2021-2022 reporting timeframe the 4-H reach was 22%.

With summer programming, we expect that our total reach will be 50% and that we will continue towards our goal of reaching 60%+ youth in the county.



Programming in Dodge County

- Ag Literacy Festival: This program gives youth an opportunity to gain knowledge regarding agriculture (Nebraska's largest industry) through sessions including but not limited to technology, careers poultry, pork, beef, dairy, water, horse, sheep, goats, corn, and soybeans. Speakers from surrounding counties and NE Farm Bureau volunteered to reach 939 youth.
- The 4-H Educator and 4-H Assistant have provided programming in all Fremont Public School sites for the first time in over a decade.

Community Club Reach 2023

- Enrollments: 240 youth age 8-18
 - 50 Clover Kids (aged 5-7)
 - 50 Fully Screened Adult Volunteers
- Youth for Quality Care of Animals
 - 4 trainings in person, 66 youth reached for 1-1.5 hours
- Public Speaking Contest 37 youth participated
 - 16 selected to compete at State Contest
- Family Livestock Judging Contest -36 participants
 - Ages from clover kid to adult with a family division
- Summer Workshops
 - Babysitting 13 youth
 - Healthy Living 18 youth
 - Clover Kids 13 Youth
 - Home Environment 19 youth
 - Entomology 10 youth
 - Arial Ag 16 youth

Work of the 4-H Assistant

4-H Assistant Roles/Responsibilities:

- Deliver educational programs in schools
 - Focus on STEM that meet school standards
- Manage educational activities and events and local volunteer efforts
 - Train 4-H Adult Volunteers
- Foster strategic relationships & implement partnership deliverables.
 - Serve on Statewide teams to bring programming to Dodge County
- Deliver programs to address issues and reach new audiences.
 - Current Assistant serves on College and Career Readiness
 Team
- Identify emerging issues and underserved audiences



Duties for a 4-H Support/ Receptionist

Support for the entire team:

- First point of contact for all visitors and calls—during the summer, several people visit the office daily
- Create/distribute newsletters, mailings,
- Support educators with data, websites, & events
- Support Office Manager as needed

Support for 4-H team:

- Curriculum, materials, organization, preparations
- Fair book development, modifications, print, online
- Summer fair support
- ShoWorks data lead
- Achievement celebration organization
- State fair
- Contests and workshops -organization
- First to meet needs of 4-H family calls/requests and front desk support
