

Length of Time during which the program will be in existence: the Economic Development Plan will be in existence for a period of fifteen (15) years from June 1, 2024 to May 31, 2039.</p> <p>b. The years within which the local sources of revenue for the Economic Development Plan will be collected shall be for a period of ten (10) years from October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2034.</p> <p>c. The source from which the funds are to be collected will be one-third (1/3) of the proceeds from the one-half of one percent (0.5%) local option sales tax adopted in 2024.</p> <p>d. The total amount to be collected from the program from local sources of revenue for the full length of the plan for the City of Fremont will be a minimum of \$12,000,000.</p> <p>e. The City Council may authorize the issuance of bonds to carry out the Economic Development Plan following a public hearing.</p> <p>f. Additional funds from other non-city sources will be sought beyond those derived from the local sources of revenue.</p> <p>g. The Goals of the Economic Development Plan will be: 1) to create new jobs; 2) to expand the labor market; 3) to retain existing jobs; 4) to attract new capital investment; 5) to broaden the tax base; and 6) to provide economic diversification to ensure economic stability and vitality for the City of Fremont and surrounding areas.</p>

<p style="text-align: center;">Resolution No. 2023-302 Proposed Sales Tax Continuation</p> <p>"Shall the governing body of the City of Fremont continue to impose the one-half of one percent (0.5%) sales and use tax upon the same transactions within the City of Fremont on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax for a period of ten (10) years beginning October 1, 2024 and ending September 30, 2034 with one-third (1/3) of the proceeds to be used for the purpose of financing an Economic Development Plan of the City of Fremont, one-third (1/3) of the proceeds to be used for the Police and Fire Departments for purposes of funding operating and capital expenses, and one-third (1/3) of the proceeds to be used for street construction and renovation, including drainage and flood control, for the benefit of the City of Fremont."</p> <p>In the event the 2024 Economic Development Plan is not approved, the entire proceeds of said sales and use tax to be equally divided between (1) the Police and Fire Departments for purposes of funding operating and capital expenses, and (2) street construction and renovation, including drainage and flood control.</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES</p> <p><input type="radio"/> NO</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">Resolution No. 638-24 Proposition No. 2 Economic Development Plan</p> <p>Shall the City of Scribner, Nebraska establish an Economic Development Plan as described below by appropriating from local sources of revenue approximately: (1) \$110,000 for fiscal year 2024-2025, and then (2) \$110,000 per year for the next 14 fiscal years thereafter.</p> <p>Description of Economic Development Program:</p> <p>The Economic Development Plan as approved by the City Council is summarized as follows:</p> <p>a. General Description of Program: The goal of the Economic Development Plan is to provide quality jobs to the citizens of Scribner. Activities included in the Economic Development Plan are grants to qualifying businesses for fixed assets or working capital or both, grants or loans for public works improvements, grants for job training, real estate purchases and options, the costs of implementation of the program, technical assistance, industrial recruitment activities, and expenses for locating qualifying businesses into the area. Qualifying businesses include those which derive their principal source of income from (1) manufacturing, (2) research and development, (3) processing, storage, transport, or sales of goods or commodities in interstate commerce, (4) the sale of services in interstate commerce, (5) headquarters facilities relating to eligible activities, (6) telecommunications activities, including services providing advanced telecommunications capability, (7) tourism-related activities, and (8) retail trade.</p> <p>b. Use of Funds: The funds shall be used for administrative expenses related to the operation of the Scribner Economic Development program. The remaining funds collected shall be allocated to qualifying businesses and projects as determined under the Economic Development Plan.</p> <p>c. Duration of Program: The Program shall be in existence from October 1, 2024 and shall continue until terminated by the City Council.</p> <p>d. Years for Collection of Funds: Collection of funds for the Economic Development Program shall be on all taxable sales beginning on October 1, 2024 to September 30, 2039.</p> <p>e. Source of Funds: The source for Economic Development Funds shall be the City Sales and Use Tax provided for in Proposition No. 1. The city may issue bonds pursuant to the Local Option Municipal Economic Development Act.</p> <p>f. Total Amount to be Collected: The total amount to be collected from local sources of revenue shall be the lesser of (1) approximately \$110,000 for fiscal year 2024-2025 and then approximately \$110,000 per year for an additional 14 years, or (2) the amounts allocated to the Economic Development Program pursuant to the City Sales and Use Tax provided for in Proposition No. 1.</p> <p>g. <p style="text-align: center;">Resolution No. 638-24 Proposition No. 1 Sales Tax Continuation</p> <p>Shall the City Council of the City of Scribner, Nebraska continue to impose a Sales and Use Tax in the amount of one and one-half percent (1 1/2%) upon the same transactions within the City on which the State of Nebraska is authorized to impose a tax, subject to the terms and conditions of the Proposition as set out below?</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Terms and Conditions:</p> <p>The terms and conditions of Proposition No. 1 are as follows:</p> <p>1. Economic Development Portion: If Proposition No. 2 passes, 100% of the one and one-half percent (1 1/2%) City Sales and Use Tax provided for in this Proposition No. 1 shall be allocated to the Economic Development Program as provided for in the Plan described in Proposition No. 2.</p> <p>2.
