

History to Remember!



On August 1, 1956, the burial of a capsule containing records of Fremont Centennial and other 100th anniversary articles was held. Fremonters were invited to attend. The capsule was welded airtight and encased in concrete before being dropped into its resting place near the courthouse steps, not to be dug up for 100 years.

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VOTING QUALIFICATIONS

To qualify to register to vote you must be a resident of this county for at least 1 day prior to the Election and obtain the minimum age of 18 before the General Election date of any year. The only trick to this requirement is that the deadline for registering to vote at any election is 2 Fridays before the election. Once registered, the only time you would have to reregister would be if your name would change, your address would change, or you wish to change political party affiliation.



Congress passed the "Motor Vehicle Law" and was incorporated into State Law. You can also register at Drivers' Examiners, state and federal agencies, or by mail by calling our office for the forms. There may be voter registration forms in phone books or state income tax booklets or on the county's website at www.dodgecounty.nebraska.gov/ under County Offices and Election Commissioner. Mail-in registrations for new voters must be postmarked by the 3rd Friday prior to an election. The County Clerk can take registrations in office up until the 2nd Friday before elections.
